Summary of Specific Feedback by Participants

- 1. The tariff setting principles and procedure may be discussed in detail especially the issues which come while determining the ARR (Aggregate Revenue requirement) of any Utility.
- 2. Time span for the program was too short, it may be arranged for a week. Component of technical visit may be increased. Brain storming sessions on critical issues and way forward on that may be a useful exercise when the highly experienced personnel of sector come together

 Secondly, the schedule of programme was quite packed having no spare time even for half a day.
 - 4. The sessions were too cramped. Programme could be designed for 5 days at least. Accommodation could have been better. There is a lot of scope for improvement.
 - 5. Program was good, however in future linking it to our Power Sector Scenario may be more helpful.
 - 6. The duration of programme was too short resulting cramping of sessions. The programme should have been at least for 4-5 days to avoid such rush towards completion of the topics.
